Matthew 26:25 - YOU SAID SO!

As we start the New Year, let's recommit ourselves to wise, scriptural management of our mouths! Proverbs 18:21 tells us that death and life is in the power of the tongue. James 3:2 says that if we control the tongue, we can control the whole body. Hundreds of other verses say the same thing, so if we really want to make the New Year the best year of our lives in Christ, it **MUST** start with a commitment to doing a better job at managing our mouths! So, my word for you today is the same word I give myself: **THINK BEFORE YOU SPEAK!**

Most Christians speak and then think, that's why they end up of having to repent of so much to God! Proverbs 10:19 says that in the multitude of words there wants not sin. In other words, the more you exercise an undisciplined tongue, the more you'll have to repent of later! Don't let that be you any longer! Now, right now, as we begin 2018 in service to our Lord, let's make a quality decision to get control of our tongues, and use our mouth **ONLY** for the glory of God. In today's verse, Jesus told Pilate that what he had just said would come to pass **BECAUSE HE SAID IT!** That's the way it always works friend. Jesus said as much in Mark 11:22-24, when He said that we would (and will) have **WHATEVER WE SAY!** In the New Year, you will have what you say, so be careful about what it is you're saying, okay? Think before you speak. Make sure your words are giving God something to work with, rather than giving the devil something to work with.

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JANUARY 03 DAILY DEVOTIONAL

John 19:30 - IT IS FINISHED!

When Jesus died on the cross, the work of fulfilling the Old Testament law was done. Up until that time, no man had successfully lived their entire life without committing sin, and thus, violating the Law of God. Remember, if you sinned in only one area, you were guilty of sinning in every area as far as God was concerned (James 2:10). So, when Jesus came, he came to fulfill the Old Testament law, and by doing that, making the way possible for God to institute the New Testament, which is the one we live under today. And now, under the New Testament, the **ONLY** law you have to keep is the law to love! That's it! Everything else is finished, and all the penalties for all the sins listed and mentioned in the scriptures have been paid for through the shed blood of Jesus. This was the message that Paul was commissioned to share, and the message which got him into so much trouble with the religious crowd. And even today, we still have that same kind of religious resistance when you try to show people that under the New Testament, the **ONLY** law we are to be charged to keep is the law of love.

Paul, under inspiration of the Holy Spirit, outlined this truth so well in the book of Romans. In Romans 13:8-10, we see the classic verses that tell us if we walk in love, we fulfill the law. Loving your neighbor as yourself takes care of everything else! And in Matthew 22:36-40, Jesus Himself told us how to fulfill the Old Testament law. We love God with all of our hearts first, and then we love our neighbors as we love ourselves. That's it! As Paul said, this kind of loving works no harm towards his neighbor, and shows no rebellion towards God. Therefore, if you fulfill these two commandments, you've fulfilled them all! So, as we move into the New Year 2018, let's remind ourselves that the Old Testament law is finished. It's done away with, and now in the New Testament, the only law that matters is the law of love. Some people think that when Jesus said "It is finished", that meant the plan of redemption was completed. But that's not true. When Jesus said those words, He still had not yet died, and had not yet gone into Hades to suffer for those 3 days of torment at the hands of the devil (Acts 2:31). No friend, our redemption was not finalized and finished until those 3 days were over, the penalty for our sins paid, and Jesus had risen from the dead - 3 days **AFTER** the crucifixion, where he said these words "It is finished". So, if you make your one great quest in life the quest to walk in love, you'll automatically fulfill all the rest of the commandments found in the Bible. Praise God! I don't know about you, but that thrills my soul. No longer do I have to be so concerned about all the little things that I do right or wrong. If I focus my time and attention on developing the love of God within me (Romans 5:5), then everything else will work itself out. It will work out for me, and work out for you too!



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JANUARY 04 DAILY DEVOTIONAL

Matthew 20:21 - WHAT DO YOU WANT?

As we enter this New Year, what do you want? What are your goals, objectives and priorities? Have you thought about them? Have you brought them before the Lord in prayer? These are things you should be doing at this time of year, right at the beginning. And Jesus is asking you the same question He was asking in our verse today, "What do you want Me to do for you?" Or, what is it that you want? You know, many Christians have not received simply because they haven't asked (James 4:2)! I know that sounds almost ridiculously simple, but it's true! I know in my own life, there have been things I've known that I need or want from God, but for whatever reason, I just never got around to asking Him for these things. And guess what? As a result of that, I never got what I needed! In John 14:14, Jesus tells us to ask Him for whatever it is we want or need, and it shall be given. But you have to ask! So, ask yourself today, have you really asked God for the things you need or want, or just made the assumption that because He knows you have these needs, He's out there working to bring them into your life?

My friend, God WANTS to bless you and meet your needs. He's not holding back from you. He wants to bless you, and give you the desires of your heart (Psalms 37:4). But on the other hand, He wants you to understand that His desire is to work WITH you, not apart from you. And therefore, He wants us to constantly realize the importance of asking for the things we need, as a way of reminding ourselves that everything comes from His hand in the first place. Hebrews 4:16 tells us to come BOLDLY to God's throne to obtain the help we need in times of need. So, if you haven't asked for the things you need or want in the New Year, how about taking time today and, in prayer, asking the Lord for whatever it is you have need of. One final thought though. Make sure your requests are in line with His Word and will for your life. First John 5:14-15 says that when we ask, we can have every assurance our requests are heard and answered IF our requests are in line with God's Word and will for our lives. So, study God's Word, and you'll know what His will is, for His Word is His will. And, for those specific areas in your life, make sure they agree with God's plan and purpose for your life, and then ask without shame, hesitation or apology!



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JANUARY 05 DAILY DEVOTIONAL Proverbs - WISDOM IS THE PRINCIPAL THING!

As we start a new year, I want to take time over the next few days to talk with you about the importance of setting proper priorities. There are many great topics and subjects to study and learn about in the Word of God, but it's always important to major on those things that God Himself says are most important. And the first of those spiritual priorities mentioned in the Word that I'd like to talk with you about is wisdom. In our verse today, we see that wisdom is the PRINCIPAL thing. That means it's most important. God expects us to GET wisdom, and KEEP wisdom. Because wisdom is the principal thing, God tells us to get it and hold on to it. And where does all this begin? By developing a proper and healthy fear of the Lord. Proverbs 9:10 says that the fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom. So, if wisdom is the most important thing, you must have the fear of the Lord in your heart and life because that is the beginning of wisdom. You cannot go any further until you develop the fear of the Lord. Does that mean we are to cower in fear of God? No, of course not! Fearing God is not being afraid of God. Fearing God is respecting Him for Who He is, and living life in light of that fact. Honoring, respecting, serving and obeying God are the ways we fear Him. Are you fearing the Lord in those ways?

So, we start with the fear of the Lord, but that is only the beginning. From there, we begin to build upon the solid foundation of fearing the Lord, and the wisdom of God becomes more and more the principal thing in terms of Bible study and day-to-day lifestyle. I suggest you read and study the book of Proverbs. That book, more than any other, contains information and instruction concerning the wisdom of God. If you want to be wise, read and apply Proverbs in your life. If wisdom is to be the principal thing in your life, you'll need to get into the book of Proverbs on a daily basis, so that you feed upon the rich instruction concerning wisdom that God places in that book. Another book to study is the book James. The book of James is often compared to Proverbs, and it's called the New Testament book of Proverbs by many. And what will you find if you study these two books? You'll find that wisdom simply knows how to manage your mouth! If you want to become wise, you must place a priority on managing your tongue, and getting control of your conversation. I suggest you take a highlighter of some kind, and highlight every verse in Proverbs and James which talk about wisdom, and see that wisdom is all about disciplining your tongue! James 1:5 says that if you lack wisdom (if you aren't very good at controlling your tongue), ask of God, who gives wisdom freely and doesn't hold back. Well, how is God going to give wisdom freely? Through His Word. He's already given you the Word, so now it's up to you to open the Bible and take the time to feed on the principals found in it. So, as we start the New Year, prioritize according to the Word of God. Wisdom - get it and protect it! It's the principal thing!



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JANUARY 06 DAILY DEVOTIONAL

1 Corinthians 13:13 - THE GREATEST OF THESE IS LOVE!

We are looking at the things in the Bible that God calls priorities. As we start the New Year, we must re-group and make sure the lion's share of our time in Bible study and application centers around the things God says are most important. Yesterday, we looked at wisdom, which Proverbs 4:7 says is the principal thing. Today, we look at Paul's classic statement to the Corinthians. In the New Testament, we have three foundational elements: faith, hope and love. Of those three, the greatest is love! Not faith and not hope. They're important of course, but not as important as love. Why is love more important the faith or hope? Because faith is the substance of things hoped for (Hebrews 11:1), but faith can only work by love. Of those three we start with hope, which then leads to faith, but faith can't be energized and put to work until love becomes the driving force in your heart. You can have all the hope in the world, and then faith to move mountains, but without love your faith won't work and your hopes will go unrealized.

According to the Amplified Translation of the Bible, 1 Corinthians 14:1 tells us to make love our ONE GREAT AIM AND QUEST IN LIFE. And if that's how God feels about the importance of walking in love, you should definitely make this a priority for the New Year! Walking in love doesn't just happen. You have to PRACTICE walking in love, and to do that, you have to take the time to meditate on the love verses, as found throughout the New Testament. Passages like 1 Corinthians 13:1-8 are classic verses you should be reading, confessing and practicing EVERY DAY. Just like lawyers practice law, and doctors practice medicine, Christians should be practicing love. And what does it mean to "practice?" It means we study about love from the Word of God, then work at loving all the unlovely people we encounter when we leave the house and mix with the world! No, it isn't easy. If it was easy, more people would be doing a better job of walking in love. The fact is, the love of God is ALREADY inside of you by virtue of the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit. But, you have to exercise that love in order for it to become the dominate force that controls your life. It doesn't happen just because you're Christian. It happens because you decide it will, and make it a priority to perfect and develop the ability to let God's love dominate you. It's a priority worth pursuing, so don't wait another day. Decide today to make love the one great quest and aim of your life!



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JANUARY 07 DAILY DEVOTIONAL John 15:17 - THE COMMAND WE MUST KEEP

Once again, as we focus on finding and fulfilling spiritual priorities in the New Year, we find ourselves being reminded of God's **COMMAND** to love one another. Notice, this is not a command to love unbelievers! It's a command to love fellow brothers and sisters in the body of Christ. The greatest way you can witness to your unsaved loved ones, fellow students, friends or co-workers is by doing this - walking in love towards fellow saints in the body of Christ. And as you have probably found out by now, if you've been saved for longer than 10 minutes, it's not an easy thing to do. It's hard, it's challenging, and it can only be done with much prayer, Bible study, meditation and practice! The love walk is our practice in life, in the same way a doctor practices medicine, or a lawyer practices law. Christians practice loving. First, loving God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength. Second, loving our neighbor as we love ourselves (Matthew 22:37). Jesus said all the law and prophets hang on this **COMMANDEMENT**.

And so when we take that commandment from God and bring it into the New Testament, we see Jesus specifically telling Christians to practice loving each other. **BY THIS**, He said, shall **ALL MEN** (that means unbelievers as well as believers) know that we are truly disciples of Christ. Not by tithing, or by church attendance, or by doing good works, or by going on the Missions Field, or anything else. In this area alone, we are to prove to the world that we're truly disciples of Christ. Loving other believers! Of course, you've found out that not everybody who claims to be Christian is someone you enjoy being with. That's where spiritual discipline and training come into play. That's where you must **PRACTICE** loving people inside the church who aren't yet as sanctified, mature and focused upon spiritual priorities as you might be! Fact is, that no matter where we gather to "fellowship", we're always going to be surrounded by others who aren't necessarily people we enjoy being with. Sure, we'll have our own circle of friends - the people who we enjoy being with and keep company with. But what about all the others? Your responsibility is to obey the Lord's commandment, and love them **UNCONDITIONALLY**. No pre-requisites to meet, no strings attached. If you're going to really advance and triumph in the New Year, you've got to set this as one of your major priorities. I've purposed to make it so in my life, how about you?



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JANUARY 08 DAILY DEVOTIONAL

Ecclesiastes 12:13 - THE CONCLUSION OF THE WHOLE MATTER

Since the beginning of the New Year, we've been looking at what the Bible calls spiritual priorities. There's no better time to discover what God considers to be most important. As we make our "New Year's Resolutions", we need to know what are, and what are not, priorities as far as God is concerned. First, we saw that the acquisition of wisdom is one of God's priorities for us. Next, we looked at the importance of walking in love, and especially towards fellow believers. And today, we will look at what Solomon wrote at the end of Ecclesiastes. After writing Proverbs and Ecclesiastes, being blessed of God with more wisdom than any other man except Jesus, he finishes up with this classic summation. What does he mean when he talks about the "conclusion of the whole matter"? He's talking about what really matters, and what's really important. And what is the conclusion of the whole matter? After all the wisdom of Proverbs and Ecclesiastes, what's the final, all-consuming revelation he comes to? Here it is: **FEAR GOD, AND KEEP HIS COMMANDMENTS.** Isn't that amazing! So simple, and yet so all-encompassing.

My friend, we can read from Genesis to Revelation, and study the Bible our whole lives, but in the end, it all comes down to this, the conclusion of the **WHOLE** (not a piece of the matter, but the whole thing) matter. All of man's dealings with God are summed up in this one statement. First, fear God. Second, keep His commandments. That's it! The word "fear" doesn't mean we cower in fear, shaking and trembling for fright when coming before God. The word fear here simply means to honor, respect and reverence God for Who He is, the Almighty One. The all-sufficient One. The omni-everything One. We fear God because He's **GOD**, and we're not! He's the Creator, and we're the created. So, we respect Him, honor Him, and pay Him the reverence due His Name. Period. He is our source of life on every level, so we fear Him. He sustains us on every level, so we fear Him. He's an all-consuming fire, so we fear Him. And, because of all of that, when He gives us a command, we're to obey. That's how we fear Him the most – by doing what He tells us to do. In our last few devotionals, we've talked about the importance of walking in love. Why? Because it's a commandment, not a request. And, that particular commandment covers all the other commandments found in the Bible. Do that one, and you don't need to be concerned with any of the others listed prior to our Lord's coming (John 13:34,35/Romans 13:8-10). As we start the New Year, I encourage you to meditate on this statement. Do you want to please God, honor God, and respect Him? Then do what this verse says to do!

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JANUARY 09 DAILY DEVOTIONAL Ecclesiastes 12:13 - SETTING YOUR YEARLY PRIORITIES

Yesterday, we began to look at this verse, as we are talking about setting spiritual priorities for the New Year. If you love the Lord, call Him your God and soon-coming King and seek to please Him while here on earth (2 Corinthians 5:9), then you need to meditate on this verse. Make sure you're a doer of this verse, not just a reader of it. What is the conclusion of everything (the whole matter)? Fear God first, and keep His commandments second. Period. That's it. Nothing more needs to be done or said about it. How do you fear God? By hiding under the table every time He calls your name? No, of course not! You fear God by doing your best to always remember that He's Almighty God, and you're just you! The Bible says God upholds (hold together) ALL things by the Word of His power. Fear Him for that! Respect Him for that! And when you come into His presence, do what Psalms 100 says to do. Come before Him with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise. Why? Because of Who He is.

You know, if you were granted an audience with the Pope at the Vatican, you wouldn't just stroll in wearing a pair of cut-offs and flip-flop sandals! No, you'd take time to properly prepare yourself for that meeting. Why? Because He's the Pope, and there is a certain social royalty and recognition that goes with that title. Regardless of whether or not his position and title is scriptural is a moot point at that moment, because he happens to be the most influential man on the planet! Like it or not, more people's lives are directly influenced by that man than anyone else on earth. So, you'd recognize that fact and give him the honor his position deserves. In a way, you'd be fearing him. The same would be true if you had the chance to visit with the President of the United States in the Oval Office at the White House. You wouldn't just "show up" in a tank top shirt and blue jeans. Even if you didn't vote for the man and don't agree with him politically, you'd still honor the office he stands in. In a way, you'd be fearing him. Well, how much more should we do that with God? The Pope, our President, and anyone else on earth are all just men. God is God, so when you come into His presence, be sure you come with singing, thanksgiving, praise and worship. By doing so, you honor Him, fear Him and show Him the respect and reverence due His name. It should be one of your priorities this year to understand this, and re-adjust the way you relate and fellowship with your Heavenly Father, whenever necessary. Yes, He's our ABBA (our Daddy), and wants us to love Him that way, but do so in context. He's our Daddy for sure, but He's also the holy, righteous and supreme Being who holds this universe together with the words of His power, and will never tolerate any rebellion or disrespect whatsoever. If you don't believe that, just ask Satan, the fallen angel who was once called Lucifer, the most beautiful angel God ever created!

JANUARY 11 DAILY DEVOTIONAL Matthew 25:18 - ARE YOU HIDING YOUR TALENTS?

This is a marvelous teaching from Jesus about what God expects from each of us. Every person on this planet, no matter who or where they are, have God-given talents and abilities which God expects them to use for His glory, and for the furtherance of the Gospel of the Kingdom of God. Someday in heaven, rewards are going to be given out to those who understood this, and with the help of the Holy Spirit, took those talents and multiplied them back to God. My question to you today is this: what are you doing with your "talents"? How are you using your abilities and assets (money & what it buys) in such a way that they will reproduce and reap a mighty harvest for the Lord's glory? Too many Christians are like the person in today's story, who because of fear (Matthew 25:25), refused to risk anything for the Lord. As a result, the Lord's anger and wrath was poured out when judgment day came around.

In the story itself, the "talents" represented the money the people had from God, and the "master" represented God. He expected them to use that money for Him - sowing, giving and investing it so that it would make more "talents" for the master. But talent could also include your natural abilities, or the abilities you've acquired through schooling, training and a lot of hard work. No matter what form your "talent" may take, whether it be money or natural abilities, you're responsible for getting involved with what you have, investing those things into something that is actively working to fulfill God's Great Commission (Mark 16:15-20). Don't hide your talents in the ground like the person did in our story today. If you do, you're going to incur the Lord's anger one day when you stand before Him. As far as He's concerned, failure to step out in faith and trust God with the resources and assets we have is to say you want to "play it safe", and never risk anything for God's work or kingdom. That's the ultimate expression of selfishness, and that's why Jesus calls a person like that WICKED, LAZY and UNPROFITABLE (Matthew 25:26-30). Don't be wicked, lazy and unprofitable any longer! If you've been hesitant to offer your money or your abilities to God out of fear for any reason, then its time you made a change, and began walking by faith! God can't multiply and bless what you don't give. The whole kingdom of God operates like men planting seeds in the ground (Mark 4:26). If you want God to bless you, risk what you have in simple faith and watch Him multiply it back to you for His glory. Then you can repeat the cycle all over again, and again, and again - continuing to grow and multiply and become more and more like Jesus expects you to be! Time is short! It is time for each Christian to rise up and be a player in the body of Christ - no longer just a selfish spectator, but an active participant!

JANUARY 12 DAILY DEVOTIONAL Matthew 28:20 - YOU ARE NEVER ALONE!

One of the last promises Jesus left us before He went back to Heaven was this one. He told all of us to go into all the world making disciples of every nation, and in the process, never to forget that He was with us always no matter where we went. It's important for you to remember that. We live in a world full of lonely people. You might feel like one of them today, and if you do, or if you ever have, let me cheer you up with this truth. Jesus is ALWAYS there with you. You are NEVER alone. You may feel like you're alone, or you may feel lonely, but that doesn't change the fact that He is at your side 24/7, wherever you are, no matter what you're going through. In fact, He is not only WITH you, but by the Holy Spirit, He is IN you! I don't know about you, but that greatly encourages me! When facing obstacles, hurdles and situations that tempt me to fear, it's so comforting and reassuring to remember that the King of kings, Jesus Christ Himself, is right there with me, and you! As you begin to tackle the problems, challenges and circumstances of the New Year, rejoice that you're not in this fight alone! You have Jesus on your side, at your side, and by His Spirit, actually living within your spirit! Praise God! Sure, all of us have had moments when we've felt alone and isolated. I have, and you have too. I remember the loneliest moment of my life, the time I first landed in the Philippines in September, 1980. As I sat in my window seat as the plane taxied to a stop at the Manila airport, it suddenly hit me! I was on the other side of the world, and I didn't know anyone and no one was there to meet me! Not only that, but I had very little money, didn't know the language and had no air-ticket back home! I had only enough money to buy a one-way airplane ticket when I left the USA, so basically, I was stuck! As I looked out the window waiting for my turn to disembark, I watched two soldiers at the bottom of the staircase with machine guns, greeting the passengers by searching their carryon bags for bombs, bullets and weapons as they disembarked the plane. No Hawaiian wreath of flowers around our necks here! In that moment I felt more alone than at any point before or after in my life. But God was there with me! In that moment, I heard the voice of the Lord clearly in my spirit. In no uncertain terms, He reassured me I was in the right place at the right time, so there was nothing to worry about. JANUARY 13 DAILY DEVOTIONAL Luke 9:51 - THE FORCE OF DETERMINATION

When it came time for Jesus to go to Jerusalem to offer Himself as our supreme sin sacrifice, the Bible says He steadfastly set his face to go. Isaiah says His face was like a flint, a picture of steely determination (Isaiah 50:7). My friend, when you discover the power and force of your determination, you'll come to realize that no force in hell can stand against you or stop you from your appointed goal in Christ. Once you set your face like Jesus did, with steely determination, you create a spiritual force within you that God honors, anoints, and empowers. One of the most effective tactics the enemy uses against us is DISTRACTION. The devil will always be trying to get us off course by distracting us from God's purpose and assignment. Determination protects you from the allure of satanic distraction. It's a power hell has no answer for. With the kind of determination Jesus showed in going to Jerusalem, you can move right on past every temptation the devil throws your way. My question to you today is this: HOW DETERMINED ARE YOU TO WALK IN THE FULLNESS OF YOUR SALVATION? Most believers live so far below God's promises, in part because they never develop the kind of determination to take them to better things in Christ. How about you? Where do you stand in all of this?

I can just imagine the look on our Lord's face when He knew it was time to go up to Jerusalem. He knew what He would have to do up there, and in His flesh, He naturally recoiled from the idea. That's why He had those moments of temptation and struggle in the garden of Gethsemane. In the natural, He didn't want to undergo the horrendous torture and pain of the passion, any more than you or I would. But because of that intense, powerful determination, He had the inner fortitude and strength to overcome and prevail. Nothing could deter His purpose or destiny, because He was DETERMINED! The good news is that same determination is within you now – it's called FREE WILL! You can decide. You can choose. You can change course. You can turn around. You can say "enough is enough"! What have you struggled with? Do you know that if you really decide to overcome in that area, you can! No matter how many times you've failed or fallen, with determination driving you, you can gain the victory. In most cases, it's the lack of real determination that dooms our efforts to secure victory in the first place. We want victory, but we're not really determined enough to charge through the enemy's distractions to a place of victory. Its time! Lower your head, squint your eyes, and in your heart of hearts, find your strength to overcome with a divine determination that no devil in hell can withstand!

JANUARY 14 DAILY DEVOTIONAL **Proverbs 27:8 - DON'T GO WANDERING OFF!**

If you have small children as a parent, or have had them before, you no doubt have had times when you would tell them not to wander off - to stay in sight and stay close! Maybe you would take them to a park or playground, and as they ran off to the swing set, you would tell them not to wander away. Why? Because as a parent, you knew that if they wandered too far from you, something bad could happen. Well, in our verse today, we find God telling all of us the very same thing. Don't go wandering off! Stay close to the Word of God, the Holy Spirit and God's perfect will for your life. Wandering is a progressive thing, isn't it? It's gradual, and in most cases, it's not an intentional thing. People don't purposely intend to end up isolated and far from protection and security, but they end up there anyway. Spiritually, many Christians are doing exactly that today - and don't realize the danger they are putting themselves in. How about you? Are you sticking close by the side of Jesus, or are you wandering somewhere outside the confines of His love, perfect will and word?

The proverb we're looking at today uses a wandering bird to illustrate the dangers in spiritual wandering. What happens to the bird that wanders too far from the nest? He never comes home! He doesn't realize or understand that there are many predators out there that are just waiting to pounce on him. And the farther the bird wanders away, the easier it is for catastrophe to occur. The same thing holds true spiritually. Spending time doing the 7 Priorities of Life each day will prevent you from wandering away from God and His protection. What are the 7 Priorities of Life? 1) Worship. 2) Praise. 3) Prayer. 4) Confession. 5) Meditation. 6) Study and reading. 7) Sharing, or witnessing. In 2 Peter 1:10, we are told what happens to those who are not diligent to stay close to God. They end up falling away. They end up stumbling, and in many cases, never get themselves back on track with God. Don't let that be you! Stay close to God, and don't start wandering away spiritually! Wandering is like drifting. It's a slow, almost unperceivable process. Have you stopped praying daily? Have you stopped reading and studying your Bible daily? Have you stopped spending time with God daily? If so, you're wandering! Get back on track today, and don't wander anymore!

Proverbs 27:20 - YOUR EYES CAN NEVER BE SATISFIED!

One of the first and most effective ways to walk in victory over your enemies is to understand them and anticipate their attacks. In James 4:1-7, the Bible will list for us the 3 enemies we have to deal with while on earth in Christ. 1) The devil and his demons. 2) The world system the devil is in control of. 3) Our dead-to-sin flesh. And in today's verse, we see a characteristic of the flesh we would be well to understand and anticipate. Our physical eyes, which are a major gateway to avenues of the flesh, are NEVER satisfied. What does that mean? It means exactly that - the flesh is NEVER satisfied with what you give it today - it will want more tomorrow. It can't be satisfied! And the eyes are one of the primary ways the flesh manifests itself. Your eyes, if left unrenewed and undisciplined, will always wander away from God and His Word. This is something you must understand and anticipate. If you don't, your eyes will take you places that you don't want to go - and you'll end up in areas of sin you never intended to go. This explains why people who seemingly have so much - always lust after more. Why? Because the eyes can't be satisfied. Give your flesh one Krispy Kreme doughnut today, and it will want a dozen of them tomorrow! You might be married to the most beautiful woman in the world, or the most handsome man on the planet, but your eyes will still want to go cruising! Why? Because that is the nature of the enemy called our flesh. Many Christians are victims of this kind of deception, and don't know that they are. With regards to financial prosperity as an example, I'm all for it because it takes lots of money and resources to fulfill the Great Commission. However, many Christians disguise their greed and selfishness by calling their coveting "prosperity". They are deceived and don't realize what is actually happening in their lives. Certainly, it's alright to live in a nice house and drive a nice car and wear decent clothing, but at some point, you should be able to say "that's enough". I mean, how big does a believer's house really need to be, unless they're planning on holding Bible Studies there each week! How expensive of a car do Christians really need to own? If you don't get control of your eyes, you'll never know when much becomes too much! Even when we are blessed abundantly by God, we need to keep our eyes on "things above (Colossians 3:1-5), and know when it is time to say: "You know, I have a very comfortable life thanks to God's goodness, so I think it's time to refocus all my resources, energies and attention on spiritual things and concentrate on funding the Great Commission". Many "prosperous" Christians have never come to that place of spiritual awareness yet. We have to DECIDE to control our eyes and the lusts of what they see and covet after. Why? Because your eyes will NEVER voluntarily come to such a decision! Your eyes will always be wanting more than what they have now, so beware and keep your perspective! For your sake, and the sake of the kingdom of God.

Judges 3:2 - UNDERSTAND THERE'S A WAR GOING ON!

Mark 9:35 - CLIMBING DOWN THE LADDER OF SUCCESS

In other words, you'd have to adopt a completely different mindset than that of the world around you. Mark 9:41 - CUPS AND REWARDS

In the last few daily devotionals, we've been talking about the idea of greatness through servanthood. This passage today further amplifies that truth. When someone is busy about the Father's business, and you offer them a cup of cold water, Jesus says they will by no means lose your reward. Therefore, we can conclude the rewards that God offers us are directly tied to the cups of cold water we offer to others. What is a cup of cold water? Well, in the context of the times in which Jesus lived when He gave this illustration, it could certainly be just that - a literal cup of cold water for someone who is hot and parched and in need of some refreshment. For us today, it could mean many things. It could mean an encouraging word to someone who is battling the temptation to quit or give up on the things of God. It could mean a sack of groceries taken to your neighbor's house if you know they're having some hard times financially. It could mean buying somebody a new pair of shoes if you notice the ones they have are old and falling apart. It could mean many things, but overall, it means being AVAILABLE with what you have to bless fellow soldiers out in the trenches doing their best to serve God and fulfill the Great Commission (Mark 16:15-20).

That's what the message of prosperity is all about, did you know that? Prosperity is not about you acquiring more things for yourself. That's what many people think is the "Prosperity message", but that's not what the Bible says about it. Prosperity is all about having CUPS OF COLD WATER – having them to give to those in need of something to keep them going in ministry. The more cups of cold water you give out, figuratively speaking, the more of a reward you're going to have in heaven some day. Too many Christians are unable to offer any water to weary Christian workers because they don't have any cups! They're cup-less! You can't offer the cold water without a cup my friend! You need the water, and you need the cup in order to be a blessing to those in need of refreshment. I don't know about you, but I want to have many cups and lots of cold water to offer my fellow Christian soldiers. I want to be a source of refreshment when others need it, and to do that, I must have the cups and cold water to give! You know, as a hobby, I like to get on my bicycle and ride. I'm a bicycling enthusiast, so I try to ride as often as I can, and when I've had the time to train, I've also participated in bike races like the El Tour de Tucson. During a race like that, you'll have people standing alongside the road with cups of water in their hands. The cyclists ride by and grab the cup for a cold drink on the fly. How long would the cyclist be able to go if those people just stood alongside the road and clapped and cheered only? The cyclist would probably never make it to the finish line because nobody gave him his cold cups of water along the race. In the race we call ministry, I want to always have a cold cup of water to give as my fellow soldiers ride on by! How about you? If you're interested in great rewards some day in heaven, here's how you're going to qualify!

Mark 9:43 - CUT OFF WHAT NEEDS TO BE CUT OFF!

In our verse today, Jesus tells us to deal with any area of weakness or chronic failure with passion and intensity. When He tells us to CUT OFF our offending hands, He's not telling us to literally cut them off. Rather, He's telling us to get radical about removing the strongholds that have secured a place in our minds or bodies, and do whatever is necessary to rid ourselves from those things consistently. In your life, what are those areas that have chronically been areas of failure for you? Whatever they are, you need to cut them off so you can move on with God. The work of God is always moving forward, and we need to be able to move with God - not be left behind because we're carrying all these weights and sins with us.

The terminology that Jesus uses here should tell us how important it is to do what He's telling us to do. The consequences are dire to say the least. According to our Lord, it's better to enter into life crippled or maimed, then to go to hell for all eternity with all limbs intact. Think about that for a moment! All of us need to stop and meditate on the consequences of what we allow in our lives in terms of sin and compromise. And to whatever degree you have allowed those things to gain a foothold within you, you must now reverse that trend and with all your heart, attack those areas to bring them down and crush them under your feet forever. Yes, that sounds radical, and it is. Your soul is eternal, and God's standards are unchangingly pure and high. In my teaching called THE CONGREGATION OF THE MIGHTY, we talk about 7 areas of management one must address to become a member in God's elite congregation. The second on those seven areas of management is this right here: MANAGING YOUR WEAKNESSES. Yours might be different than mine, but everybody has inherent areas of strength and weakness. You have to honestly determine what those areas of weaknesses are, then determine to do whatever it takes to rid yourself of those areas of failure and sin consistently. This is, in essence, what Jesus was talking about when He told us to cut off offensive hands or feet. Cut off those areas where the devil has gained access. Do it now! Do it today! Repent for the failures before God, and get on with your life!

Joshua 14:6 - DON'T FORGET GOD'S WORD!

When it came time to divvy up the Promised Land, Caleb came to Joshua and reminded him of what God had told both of them 45 years earlier! Imagine that! Without the benefit of all we have today in terms of word processing, this man took the Word of God and held it in his heart for 45 years. He quoted God's promises to Joshua as if it had been given the day before! This is a fabulous lesson for all of us to take note of. When the crises of life come your way, and when everything looks like you're going down to defeat - its **KNOWING WHAT GOD HAS SAID** that will begin the process of bringing you through to victory. Caleb said to Joshua: **YOU KNOWWHAT THE LORD SAID ABOUT US BACK THEN.** In other words, Caleb was basing his present day faith on something God had told him 45 years earlier. Are you doing the same thing with God's Word?

Our responsibility is to find out what God has said, and **HOLD ON TO IT!** Never let it go! Meditate on it, and get it down into your heart where the devil can't get at it. This is what Caleb did. Imagine his situation for a moment. He was sent back out into the desert to wander for 40 years - not because of his unbelief, but because of the unbelief of all the other Jews. And out in that desert, day by day, wandering as they did, he watched every unbeliever die off one by one. But never did he allow what he saw daily to sway him from the promise he had in his heart from God. What an example to follow! They wandered for 40 years - not 40 minutes, days, weeks or even months. **YEARS!** And even after the 40 years of wandering, and then the 5 more years it took to get to this point of time where he's standing before Joshua, he quoted word for word what God had told them through Moses. Friend, no matter what - never ever forget what God has said! That Word from heaven is your ticket to victory! God's Word has within it the power to deliver you from **ANY SITUATION** you'll ever find yourself in. When the devil came against Jesus with his temptations, Jesus quoted the Word of God to defeat him. Before you can quote it you have to know it! That's why the Bible says to study to show yourself approved unto God (2 Timothy 2:15). Study! Know what God has said. What men say about your situation doesn't matter. It's only what God has said that counts! His Word is power, and His Word is eternal. Remember that, and don't forget God's Word **TO YOU!**

Joshua 14:7 - SPEAK FORTH FROM YOUR HEART!

When Caleb and Joshua were facing thousands of people who were doubting God's promises in one accord, they spoke from their heart. They knew that true faith comes from the heart, not from the head. As you recall, those two men were two of twelve spies sent to do recon work on the Promised Land. They were gone 40 days, and when they came back, 10 gave an evil report of doubt and unbelief, and only Caleb and Joshua gave a good report of faith. Well, if you know the story, the Jews believed the majority report (as is usually the case with people) of doubt and unbelief. What was the result? They cried all night, and had a big pity-party for themselves! But no matter, because when you speak from your heart it doesn't matter if you're the last man on earth standing in faith. You'll hold your ground because you're not talking out of your head, but out of your heart. True faith is always from the heart, never from the head! If you're going to develop in faith, learn to listen to your heart, not your head.

When Caleb was talking to Joshua, he said the evil report of doubt and unbelief had made the people's heart melt with fear. But in that very moment, Caleb's faith grew stronger because he was speaking and believing out of his heart, not his head. This is the way of faith. Your head may be screaming one thing, but your heart is your sure guide. The devil can try to disguise his voice so that you think that it is God talking to you, but he can't do a thing about what you have down in your heart! Matthew 24:2 - GET YOUR EYES OFF THE TEMPORARY THINGS!

Joshua 6:2 - SEE!

When God was talking to Joshua about the conquest of Jericho, He said something to him that blesses me every time I read it. God said, "See, I have given you the city, the king and all the city's inhabitants". When God told Joshua to SEE something, He was telling him to walk by faith and not by natural sight (2 Corinthians 5:7). From the natural perspective, all Joshua could see were these huge walls staring at him, with enemy soldiers looking down at him from the top. But God told him to see by the spirit, to walk by faith and believe that the city WAS ALREADY CONQUERED. Notice, that when God told Joshua about the city, He used the past tense to describe what the situation was. He told Joshua that He HAD GIVEN the city to him and the Jews. As far as God was concerned, it was already a done deal. That's the way He operates, because Romans 4:17 tells us that God always calls those things which be not as though they were. And because we're made in his image and likeness, He expects us to learn to do the very same thing.

Whenever you're staring at your "walls of Jericho", figuratively speaking, follow the directions that God gave Joshua. See victory by the eye of your faith, and realize that the victory is ALREADY WON as far as God is concerned. Just like how God told Joshua that He had ALREADY given him the city, so too, whatever it is that you're in need of today from the hand of God, remember that as far as He is concerned, He has ALREADY given you whatever it is you're standing in faith for. Ephesians 1:3 tells us that God HAS BLESSED US with EVERY spiritual blessing in Christ. That's past tense, right? Of course, the unrenewed mind will have trouble with this because it always wants to see something before accepting the fact that the victory has been won. With God, and the things of God, it's always exactly the opposite from that kind of mindset. God wants you to see by the eye of faith BEFORE you see anything with your natural eyes to indicate you have what you're standing in faith for. Basically, because God is no respecter of persons, He'll be telling you the same thing He told Joshua as he stood before the walls of Jericho. He'll say to you, "SEE!" I HAVE GIVEN YOU YOUR VICTORY, YOUR ANSWER, YOUR HEALING and YOUR PROVISION". Oh, praise God, I get excited when I teach on these things! You should too, because God is always good for His Word my friend. Always! You just need to understand the ways of faith!

Romans 14:1 - NEVER MIND THE DOUBTFUL THINGS!

When Paul wrote to the Roman church, he instructed them to avoid getting into disputes about "doubtful things". What are doubtful things? They are those issues that Christians fuss and fight about amongst themselves, but which the Bible is basically silent on. What kinds of issues or things? Things like going to movies, dancing, alcoholic beverages, watching TV, dress codes and jewelry, getting involved in politics, and things like that. If you've been saved for anywhere longer than 1 hour, you've no doubt been exposed to some of these "doubtful things" in your church circles. The point Paul was trying to make here is that as far as God is concerned, these are things which aren't that important, so He doesn't want us spending all of our time fighting over our disagreements in these areas. For us as Christians, our job is preach the Gospel to the lost (Mark 15:16-20), and disciple new believers into a closer walk with the Lord (Matthew 28:18-20). And none of these ""doubtful things"" are listed in our Lord's command to preach the Gospel in all the world! That right there should tell us that if it's not that important to God, it shouldn't be that important to us.

In our ministry in the Philippines, I'm constantly working to educate, and in some cases, re-educate my pastors about this issue. Like Paul, my desire is see us all major on the things that are really important, and not to spend time and energy fussing over smaller issues of choice that don't really have anything to do with the Gospel message. In today's verse, Paul was instructing his spiritual children to receive newcomers into the church, but NOT for the purpose of trying to impose upon them codes of lifestyle and conduct that only lead to disputes, quarrels and strife. In the next few days, we will take a longer look at these things, because in these last days, we need to stay focused on what really matters to God, and that's bringing people into the saving knowledge of Jesus. In His mind, that's what is really important, not whether we all agree on every "issue" or "lifestyle choice" we make in this life. So matter what your heritage or background may be - relax and let God talk to you about your own personal lifestyle. The body of Christ is made up of people that have come out of many diverse and different religious backgrounds, nationalities and culture groups worldwide. Let's not let those differences hinder us from walking in love towards the unbelievers, and especially, towards God and one another!

Romans 14:6 - BEING FULLY PERSUADED IN YOUR OWN MIND!

When Paul gave his instructions to the Roman church (and for all of us, since it was inspired by the Holy Spirit) about avoiding the issue of doubtful things (Romans 14:1), he told them that everyone was to be FULLY PERSUADED IN THEIR OWN MINDS. This is the key to understanding and managing all of the issues that create small wars within the body of Christ. When it comes to issues that the Bible doesn't specifically list as sins, we are to follow our own conscience, and make our decisions before God accordingly. Here's an example. If you personally don't like wearing jewelry (or lots of it), that's fine. That's your choice, and God will honor it. But you can't get up and legislate that from the pulpit as if your personal choice is God's chosen way for all of us. Each person needs to be fully persuaded in their own mind. Some folks like to wear lots of jewelry, some don't. God tells all of us to be following our own heart in these matters, and that whatever we decide is ok with Him. Why? Because as far as He's concerned, these things aren't that important. Some people don't think it's right for men to wear earrings, or people to wear tattoos, but that's just a matter of personal opinion and choice. It's no sin to wear an earring if you're a man, God really doesn't care one way or the other. Wearing one doesn't drive God away, and not wearing one doesn't bring God any closer, no matter what Old Testament verse someone pulls out of context to try and declare otherwise. After being born again and devoting myself to fulltime missionary work, I went through a season in my life where I wore an earring for about three years. One day I just noticed them on a few men I knew, and thought they were nice looking, so I got one. Then one day about three years later I just came to a place where I didn't like it anymore, so I decided to get rid of it and that was it. And guess what? God continued to work in me and through me before I wore the earring, while I had one and after I took it out. It didn't bother Him one bit one way or the other. But because I know not everybody agrees with my opinion on this issue, I was always conscious of any pastor or minister whom I knew wasn't comfortable with men wearing earrings. So whenever I was going to their church, I would ask them ahead of time if it was a problem for them, and if they said it was, I would just remove the earring while there for ministry, then put it back in after leaving town. No harm done and no one offended. Tattoos are another flash point for so many. Personally, I don't like them – on men or women, but you know what, the younger generation doesn't think like I do about such things. What I may consider to be an ugly staining of the human body – is to them an art form that they really get into. Anyone reading this who is doing any outreach at all with unsaved people younger than 40 knows this to be true. Does God prohibit a tattooed individual from receiving their salvation because they are tattooed from head to foot? No. Does God abandon a Christian and send them to hell if they get a tattoo after receiving Jesus as Lord and Savior. No. More importantly is the point in all of this that Paul was making to the Roman church – these are "doubtful things" that are left to each person's conscience. Arguing about such stuff is only a waste of time and energy. It only creates divisions we don't need in these last days.

You see, many things we fight about, and refer to as "sins", aren't sins at all. They're just personal choices that God leaves up to us to decide personally. Remember friend, God sees the whole body of Christ worldwide, not just the part you're familiar with. Some people in certain countries think it's a sin to drink wine, but in other countries they don't. European Christians drink wine or beer like American Christians drink water. So, does that mean all European Christians sin when they drink wine or beer? Of course not! And by the way, Jesus not only drank wine (the alcoholic version please), He made wine from water at the Cana wedding. So if drinking wine is a sin, Jesus was a sinner! Well, of course we know He never sinned in anyway,



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so what does that tell us about this issue of wine? The bottom line, it's a matter of culture, geography and personal choice. The Bible says drunkenness is a sin, but, as an example, millions of Christians have a glass of wine or beer with their meals in Europe, and they don't get drunk, so it's not a sin to them in the eyes of God. As far as God is concerned, **THE ISSUE IS ONE OF SELF-CONTROL AND BALANCE.** That's all. Over-indulgence in **ANYTHING** is sin, but that doesn't make certain lifestyle choices a sin just because excess in those areas leads to sin. I haven't had a cup of coffee in 30 years, but I'm surrounded daily by multitudes of believers who can't get started each day without some. There are millions of Christians out there addicted to coffee - they can't get by without their morning cup or two (or more) of Joe! Certain Christians in other parts of the world might say such people are living in sin, but are they? Oh yeah, Christians in some other countries think it's a sin to drink coffee, did you know that? They have no problem with wine, but their issue is with coffee! They think it's a drug because of the caffeine in it. So, does that make all of the Christians who drink coffee a sinner because they drink it, or because somebody else says so? Of course not! One other point to emphasize here. The Bible says the **GLUTTON** and **THE DRUNKARD** shall come to poverty (Proverbs 23:21). Notice the glutton is listed right along with the drunkard. Everyone knows what a drunkard is, right? Someone who can't control the amount of alcohol they consume, and have therefore lost control of all normal faculties and modes of expression. What is a glutton? Someone who eats too much and can't control their appetite, leading to obesity and a host of other health-related problems. Look around. It will take you about 15 seconds to see tons (no pun intended) of people who obviously can't control their food intake - and many of them are believers. So are they any less holy or saved than people who aren't overweight? Come on folks! We could go on and on, but let's follow Paul's example. Let's move on from all of this. Time is running out - **LET EVERY PERSON BE FULLY PERSUADED IN THEIR OWN MINDS!** Its time to major on the majors, and minor on the minors! The gospel is not about food and drink (Romans 14:17), or any of these other peripheral issues, but righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit!

Romans 14:23 - THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN DOUBTFUL THINGS AND SIN

We're talking about the issue of DOUBTFUL THINGS, listed in Romans 14:1. God, through Paul, tells us not to get into disputes over things that the Bible doesn't specifically call sin, but which some Christians erroneously call sin. Issues like dress code, food, the drinking of alcoholic beverages, jewelry, going to movies, watching TV, dancing and other things that many believers claim to be ""sins of the world"". I wonder what the self-appointed critics would say if they traveled with Jesus back when He was here! Jesus went to parties, and was always the life of the party - without getting drunk! In fact, His lifestyle was so radical and extreme to the religious elite of His day, the Pharisees referred to Him as a wine-bibber (Matthew 11:19-20/Luke 7:34). Do you know what that term means? It means someone who is always drinking wine! I know in our own ministry experiences, we've been criticized and gossiped about over these types of issues. When we've gone to certain churches to speak, some of the women have stared at my wife as if she were the devil incarnate. Why? Because she wears make-up, has a short hair style, and frequently wears pant-suits. Oh my God! Stop the world and let me get off! We've been in services where some well-intentioned but totally ignorant believer gets up and, supposedly under the anointing of the Lord, belts out a condemning "prophecy" about how all the women presently wearing slacks in the service are going to go to hell! Oh yeah, I'm not kidding. I'm sorry to say, there are many Christians out there who think their only mission in life is to make everybody else live like they do. How sad! Do you think that's what Jesus died and rose from the dead for? So that we go into all the world and condemn people for the way they happen to live or look? That's not the gospel my friend!

Our job is to preach the gospel, not tell everybody else how we think they should live their lives. Of course we should stay away from sin at all times, and we should teach that to those we minister to. However, the Bible is quite clear about what God calls sin, and the doubtful things are not included! Passages like Galatians 5:19-21 are clear about what God calls sin. Proverbs 6:16-19 is another example showing us what God considers sin. Then there is also the sin of UNBELIEF (Hebrews 3,4). Many Christians who want to tell you how to live your life are many times guilty of this particular sin - the sin of unbelief. Romans 14:23 says whatever is not of faith is sin. So, yes, preach against sin, but the doubtful things are not sins! They are simply areas where God leaves it up to us to decide what is acceptable or not FOR US PERSONALLY. Read Romans 14 carefully - the whole chapter. I want to fulfill the Great Commission, not get bogged down in denominational wars over issues that are supposed to be decided in the privacy of one's own conscience. So let's concentrate our efforts on what really matters, and leave the doubtful things to each person individually. Amen! That's the true message of liberty in the New Testament, and that's the message we're charged to share with the world!
